Food and water are the number one items that should be considered respectively for long-term and short-term storage. However, at the same time, you might decide to purchase or have the following items on-hand.

Consider also having a family home evening to discuss what else might be needed on this list.

- Aluminum foil and plastic wrap
- An inflatable kiddie pool or camp shower

- Baby supplies cloth diapers, pins, bottles, blankets, clothes, etc.
  - Bags: paper/plastic and cloth
  - Battery operated lanterns
  - Sturdy bikes and tie repair kits
    - Binoculars
    - Board games
    - Bottle openers
    - Brush/comb, hair ties
      - Candle holders
    - Canning equipment
    - Canvas shopping bags
  - Chalk/eraser, and blackboard
  - Cheesecloth and nylon net
    - Gease pencils
      - Clean rags
- Cleaning items, from hand soap to detergent. Also a scrub board
  - Cloth napkins
- Clothesline and wooden clothespins
  - Coats/jackets/sweaters
    - Cold and hot packs
      - Cotton balls
      - Dental supplies
        - Dish cloths
  - Duct tape and reflective tape
    - Duffle bags
    - Dust pan
- Elderly equipment from walkers to bedpans and even an extra wheelchair as needed
  - Extension cords indoor and outdoor
  - Extra air mattresses or cots
  - Extra gardenhose and nozzles
  - Eyedroppers of various sizes

- Eyeglass repair kits
- Fingernail brushes to wash with and emory boards
  - Fly paper
  - Flyswatters
  - Foam camping pads
  - Folding cloth camping chairs
    - Folding table
- Supply of mechican pencils and lead
- Garden trowels and hand shovels
  - Goggles safety ones
  - Goo remover aka Goo Gone
    - Hair cutting scissors
  - Hand axe, nails, screws, screwdriver, hammer, etc.
  - Hand-sewing equipment
  - Hard hats and sturdy gloves
    - Hot water bottle
      - Ice chest
      - Ice scraper
- If you live where you might be flooded out: a small boat or canoe of some kind with a paddle/oar
  - Insect repellant
- Jar openers the type that lets you get leverage on the lid
  - Kitchen timer
- Knitting and crochet needles and a supply of yarn
  - Leather punch and knife
    - Life preservers
      - Lip balm
- Locks combination, keyed, and other types as needed
  - Magnifying glass
  - Manual can openers

- Maps
- Measuring cups metal
- Measuring spoons metal with engraved markings.
- Medical supplies (big topic)
  - Metal garbage cans
- Moth balls, cedar balls, and smelling salts
- Nail clippers both human and pet
  - Newspaper supply
    - Note pads
  - Outdoor cooking equipment, including dutch ovens and fuel
    - Outdoor thermometers
- Pail for carrying water or whatever
- Paintbrushes and paint as needed
  - Paper clips
- Pea shellers, corn huskers, apple peelers and corers, etc.
  - Pet supplies/food/carriers
- Plant pots for starting seedlings
- Plastic bags bread, ziplock, etc.
  - Playing cards
  - Pocket knife
  - Portable potty
  - Pregnancy test kits and baby birthing information/equipment
- Rain gauge for keeping track of rainfall
- Rennet tablets for cheese-making
  - Rubber bands
  - Rubber boots
  - Safety pins heavy duty
  - Sanitary napkins and supplies
    - Scissors
    - Scouring pads

- Sewing patterns
- Shoe and boot laces
- Sleeping bags and camping equipment
  - Solar calculators
    - Solar oven
- Songbooks and simple instruments
  - Spare batteries
  - Spare buttons and zippers
    - Spare pills
    - Staples and stapler
  - Straight or safety razor for shaving
    - Straws
  - Strike anywhere matches
    - Strong glue
    - Sturdy shoes
    - Sunscreen and aloe gel
      - Toothpicks
  - Tow strap for vehicles
    - Twist ties
- Utility knives the kind that take the disposable blades or razor blades
  - Plastic food grade gloves
    - Gardening gloves
    - Hats for warmth
    - Extra blankets
    - Vegetable peeler
    - Walking Canes
- Wax, candle molds, and a double boiler for melting wax
  - WD-40
  - Weapon of your choice
- Wheelbarrow get a good quality metal or heavy duty plastic one

- Wind up clocks
- Windshield wiper blades
- Winter scarves, gloves, mittens
  - Wonderbox Oven

Lots of things to think about. Don't worry that you don't have it all, most of never will! But you can pick out a few things that capture your attention and store them
